## St Cynog, Defynnog

Easter week began with Palm Sunday and a dramatised reading of the Passion on Good Friday and the Vigil on Easter Eve. Our celebration of the Eucharist on Easter Day was enlivened by a narration of the Easter story by the Off the Bus Club.

The January storms damaged part of the roof but, thanks to our insurer, we were able to get it promptly repaired by Jenkinsons Builders of Aberllyfni who specialise in historic buildings and have been able to weather the May hailstorms. However, in April a bell rope broke and so we are waiting for a new rope to be delivered. We pray that there will be no further excitement in 2015!

#### St Ilid, Crai

Preparations are afoot for a Flower Festival on  $11^{th}$  &  $12^{th}$  July. Each organization in the community is invited to create a display (not necessarily just flowers) representing a country of their choice fitting with the theme of the United Nations World Population Day on  $11^{th}$ .


