The idea of privacy and of a right to privacy is something which is very jealously guarded by some people, some of whom may be said to be in the public eye, and yet who want to control the access, the amount of information which other people may have of them. I wonder how illusory this idea of privacy is, though? There is so much information, so much data out there in the world, information about our whereabouts, data about our spending habits, information about our interests, data about our friends and family. How much is known and by whom about us? The rise of technology whilst it has its positive side, allowing almost instant communication around the world, comes also with its negative side, an often unwitting, unnoticed surrender of our privacy. Emails can be very easily shared so can our Facebook friends, contacts and the communities of which we are part, and GPS technology enables our every movement to be tracked. If we stopped and thought about the surrender of our privacy would it worry, alarm even frighten us, especially as the information and data can be used in all kinds of ways which we would not wish? Yet there is one who is far greater than any information gathering and storage system whom we acknowledge and recognise in every act of worship - God. God will only use the knowledge of us for our own good.



The Battle of Agincourt, on 25 October 1415, is one of the best-known events in British history. The story of Henry V's forces epic defeat of a much larger French army has been immortalised in familiar tales, plays and poetry familiar. What is less well known is the role played by Wales in Henry's stirring victory. Five hundred Welsh archers and 23 men-at-arms travelled to fight in France and were key to Henry V's success at Agincourt. Many of these brave men came from the Brecon, from towns and villages strung out along what became the A40. As one of the villages that supplied men to the ranks of the Welsh archers 600 years ago, Trecastle did its bit to mark the anniversary of the Battle of Agincourt by hosting the Agincourt 600 Wales touring exhibition compiled by Brian Davies at St David's Church, Llywel.

Harvest 2015: Sowing seeds of peace for vulnerable women in Delhi.

"What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if you say you have faith but do not have works? Can faith save you? If a brother or sister is naked and lacks daily food, and one of you says to them, 'Go in peace; keep warm and eat your fill', and yet you do not supply their bodily needs, what is the good of that? So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead." (James 2 verses 14-17)

This Harvest the benefice of Blaenwysg will be joining Us. (the charity formerly known as the USPG) in supporting the Delhi Brotherhood Society (DBS) as it reaches out to vulnerable women in Delhi who are facing violence and discrimination.

The Delhi Brotherhood Society (DBS), with support from Us., runs a women's empowerment programme that is bringing peace to Delhi's marginalised communities.

One aspect of this work involves Women's Community Councils, at which prominent members of the community hold hearings to resolve local disputes – often situations of domestic violence and marital conflict. The couples, and members of their family, are summoned to appear and resolutions can be reached without the need for fines, court fees or imprisonment that would further impoverish families.

One of the reasons for the success of the councils is that women in the community are both witnesses to proceedings and able to verify whether rulings are being upheld. The people are accountable to each other.

The councils are also an example of inter-faith co-operation. While DBS is a Christian organisation, the councils are in the hands of the people – whether Hindu, Muslim or Christian. There is no discrimination according to faith.

DBS council facilitator Kiran Bala said: There is much injustice inflicted upon women. But God continually raises people up to challenge these atrocities. When DBS intervenes in a situation of injustice, it is the intervention of God.'

DBS also operates a 24-hour helpline that receives up to 35 calls per day. The helpline workers can provide an emergency response and shelter if required. Sometimes they contact the police. Other times they use the community councils to resolve disputes.

DBS is also working to inform women about their legal rights, and it provides vocational skills training so that women are better able to support their families.

Your donations will fund shelter, counselling and legal support.
