Once again we find Christmas fast approaching.




Many of us may well be caught out and have

# Meeting God in Mark - Rowan Williams.

The former Archbishop of Canterbury, is noted for his great intellect and learning and if rthat puts you off this short book, that would be a great pity. The depth of his learning can be glimpsed behind its pages but does not intrude. He skilfully and beguilingly leads us rthrough the Gospel of Mark, giving a clear and coherent overview of that gospel and what Mark sought to do in writing it. He deals very wisely with the problem of the ending in Mark (Mk.16:8) and he says that "his text begins and ends in mystery". Rowan suggests rthat Mark is a telling of revelation, of change in ourselves as equally in our world view. The opening words of the Gospel tells us of this:- "The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God." (Mk. 1:1) and its end is with us, its hearers, its readers.

### St Teilo's, Llandeilo'r Fan – and at St Fagan's Museum

You probably know our own St.Teilo's church in Llandeilo'r Fan, but have you been to the beautifully reconstructed St.Teilo's church at St.Fagans, Cardiff?

The church, originally at Llandeilo Tal-y-bont, had fallen into disrepair and the roof had gone. As the rain washed the limewash from the walls medieval paintings and Latin texts were discovered all over the interior walls. Conservators from the National Museum of Wales meticulously labelled each main stone of the church and removed them to the National Museum of Welsh Life at St.Fagans, first carefully removing what was left of the illustrations. The church has been completely rebuilt on the new site and the outside whitewashed as it would have been. Inside the church has been painted with all the figures and inscriptions which would have been seen by congregations in the 12th-15th centuries. The vivd colours and gold leaf decoration brings it all to life. It is believed that the church was particularly well endowed by pilgrims on their way to St.David's, but our own St. Teilo's church would have been similarly decorated. Go along and see it for free, and then come to our own St. Teilo's at 3pm on 2nd Sunday each month and join in the continuing worship of God in this ancient and pretty church.
