

They are placed on the outside of buildings and as soon as you switch them on, they tell you what to do. That's right - the machine talks to you. Since the start of the campaign to place these in public places in Wales, eight people have been saved by members of the public. At a short training session in Trecastle village hall, about 80 people learned how to use these life-savers. Look out for more training sessions soon.

A Christmas message from Revd. Caroline Owen, Vicar of the benefice of Dan-yr-Epynt


Dear friends,

Community Action for Road Safety (C.A.R.S)

The Campaign held an open meeting on 9th October with guests Chris Davies Conservative M.P. Brecon and Radnor, William Powell Liberal Democrat A.M. for Mid and West Wales. Dave Howells introduced the meeting noting that there is a great concern about increasing speeding in the area, serious and fatal car collisions and worries of locals about motorcycle speed and the small percentage of inconsiderate drivers and riders.



C.A.R.S. has contacted villages and communities with similar problems within a 30 mile radius of Sennybridge and hope they support our goals and possibly share resources such as the mobile speed checks. Unfortunately, a bid was submitted to The Police Commissioners Fund for a mobile speed camera and was turned down, although it appeared to meet all the criteria.

The meeting discussed speeding motorbikes and lorries which frequently travel at high speed through the villages. The area is attracting increasing numbers of cyclists who are also vulnerable to speeding vehicles. Motorbike noise was also a concern since some can be heard several miles away before they get to our villages.

Focusing on the objectives of C.A.R.S no-one wants to drive motorists or motorcyclists away from the Brecon Beacons, but there needs to be education, speed enforcement and respect for this rural environment. C.A.R.S. wants to see excessive speed reduced lawfully and punished accordingly. There needs to be a visible/tangible deterrent for unacceptable and unlawful speed and anti-social driving through our villages, and on the open road between villages. Chris Davies reminded the meeting that there are two main issues: appropriate speed limits and how they are enforced.

William Powell suggested a petition against excessive speed, enforcing speed signage, education of motorists. Trecastle have already had a petition with 125 signatures, but didn't believe that this was strong enough to be accepted as legitimate evidence for changes to be made. However, the petition still exists and could be used as part of a further campaign.

It was suggested that a community neighbourhood team should be created to work more closely with Police. The next task for C.A.R.S. will be to focus on a set of proposals and engaging with schools and local news organisations. Chris Davies promised to support the cause and he would be contacting Christopher Salmon, the Police Commissioner immediately to ensure he would be able to attend the next meeting.




